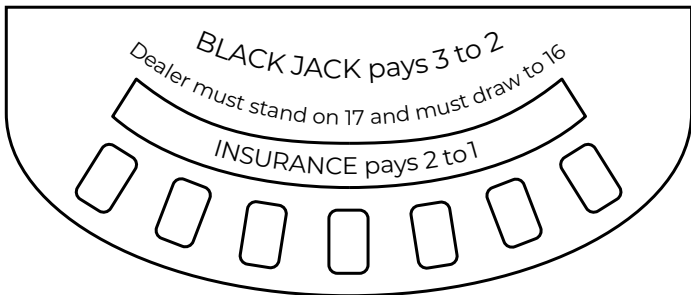
«Score 21!»

Quick reference guide for a thrilling game of Blackjack.

Blackjack's a buzz! Bring on the excitement and dive into the fascinating world of our casino. Questions? Talk to us! For us, it's about making your visit to our casino a memorable one in every way. And who knows, maybe you'll hit your lucky streak today!

Table

- Blackjack is played at a semi circular table with seven gaming boxes arranged around.
- Seated players are referred to as "box holders".
- Standing players must accept box holders' decisions.



Card values



Cards 2 through 10 are worth their face value



Face cards are worth 10 points



Aces are worth 1 or 11 points

Rules of the game

- The object of the game is to get closer to a score of 21 than the bank (represented by the dealer), but without going over.
- As a player, you play against the bank.
- Each player has his or her own playing box.
- Unoccupied boxes can also be played on: either by players at the table (the closer seat decides; if seats are equally distant from the box, the lower seat number decides), or by standing players.
- Seated players take priority over standing players.
- It is possible to participate in the game without the right to control the other boxes (by both seated and standing players), but only up to the box maximum.

How to play

- The bank opens the betting phase by announcing, "Place your bets please."
- The betting phase for the box ends when the bank calls out, "No more bets please".
- Each box holder and the bank receive one card.
- Next, only the box holders are dealt a second card each.
- The cards are all laid face-up on the table.
- In the order of the box numbers, each box holder can request as many additional cards as desired to approach or reach 21.
- A player whose cards exceed 21 immediately loses his or her bet.
- After the last box holder has finished drawing any additional cards (by saying "Stay" or "No"), the bank draws a second card for itself. The bank draws another card if the card score is 16 or less, and cannot draw any more cards if it has a card score of 17 or more.
- If the bank's card score exceeds 21, all remaining players automatically win.
- If the bank's card score is less than 21, only those players whose cards are closer to 21 than the bank win the game.
- If a player and the bank have the same score, it is a "Stand-off" (i.e. a tie), and the player keeps his or her bet.

Possible winnings

- The winnings are equal to the bet (1 to 1) if the player's box has a better score than the bank.
- Players with a Blackjack receive a 3:2 payout of their bet.
- Our staff will be happy to inform you about the current side bets.

Concepts and game situations



“Blackjack” refers not only to the actual game, but also to achieving 21 points with the first two cards. A Blackjack beats all other card combinations.



“Doubling” is possible for the first two cards, but it is possible to draw only one additional card. An opponent may double only if the box holder has doubled his or her bet as well.



Players may split only if their first two cards are identical, i.e. have the same value. The player proceeds with a “split hand”, i.e. with two separate bets. Each split hand requires an additional bet equal to the first bet. The player can now draw as many additional cards as desired, except when splitting Aces, then it's only one card per hand. In this case, “21 on one hand” is not considered a Blackjack because the combination does not consist of only the first two cards. Our staff will let you know how many times you can split, and will also be happy to explain any possible side bets.



When asked by the bank, the player responds with “Card” if he or she would like to be dealt another card. (Tap the table with your fingers.)

The player responds with “Stay” if he or she wants to stay and does not want another card. (Hand gesture: wave aside.)



“Insurance” box: If the first card the bank draws is an ace, the player can protect himself or herself against the possibility of the bank winning a Blackjack by placing half the bet in the “Insurance” box. If the bank draws a Blackjack, the insurance is paid at 2:1. Otherwise, it is collected.

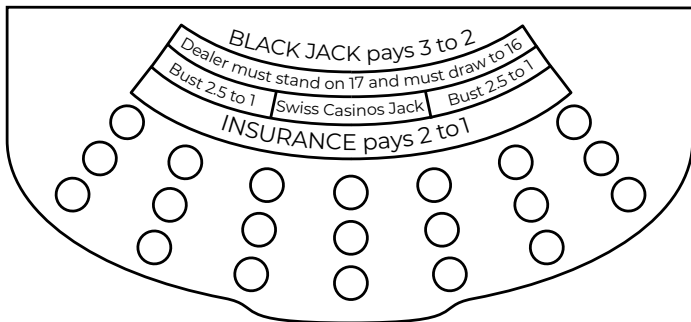
Swiss Casinos Jack / Bust

Side betting for Black Jack

For you, it's about having more opportunities to win at Blackjack. For Swiss Casinos Zurich, it's about giving you just that: Swiss Casinos Jack lets you bet on the bank's potential Blackjack. Your bet gives you more chances of winning a variety of different jackpots!

Table

- The layout for the two extra chances is above the "Insurance Line" in a separate semicircle.



Rules of the game

Bets must be placed before the first card is dealt. All players participating in the basic game can place bets. Placing a bet on the “Swiss Casinos Jack” field lets you play all three variations of Blackjack, and win the corresponding amount if the dealer draws a Blackjack combination for himself or herself.



Swiss Casinos “Jack is Black”: Blackjack with a black-colored jack and any ace: **Payout: 50 to 1**



Swiss Casinos “All Red”: Blackjack with one red ace and one red card (10, jack, queen, or king): **Payout: 25 to 1**



Swiss Casinos “Mix”: Blackjack with all remaining card combinations (ace and one 10-point card):
Payout: 10 to 1

Bust

You win 2.5 times the bet placed on the “Bust” field if the bank’s card total is over 21.

Swiss Casinos Poker Bet

Side betting for Black Jack

You want to bet on a Flush, a Straight or a Three-of-a-Kind: Go for “Swiss Casinos Poker Bet”! To win, all you need is your first two face-up cards in front of your box and the bank’s first face-up card. If these three cards combine to form one of the winning combinations of Flush, Straight, or Three-of-a-Kind, you receive an 8.5 to 1 payout for the bet you placed on the extra field.

Rules of the game

Make sure you place your bets before the opening deal; you are required to have placed a bet in the basic Blackjack game. “Swiss Casinos Poker Bet” gives you the chance to win with three different combinations of cards. Every Flush, Straight, or Three-of-a-Kind with the first three face-up cards wins 8.5 to 1. Again, you’ll need your first two cards in front of your box and the bank’s first face-up card to win. As applicable, your winnings are paid out immediately – at which point, you are free to draw additional cards in your box, which will not be included in your “Swiss Casinos Poker Bet” side bet.

Hand rankings

Your first two cards in front of your box and the bank’s first face-up card.



- **Flush:**
3 cards of the same suit
-



- **Straight:**
3 consecutive cards of different suits. Aces are worth 1 or 11 points.
-



- **Three-of-a-Kind:**
3 cards of the same value

Progressive Jackpot

Side game for blackjack

Rules

A CHF 5 bet must be placed on the designated “coin spot” before any cards are dealt. This must be accompanied by a bet on the base game. It is not possible to play progressive jackpot on its own. If a blackjack appears in your box, you will receive the following payout.



Blackjack in any combination without a jack
CHF 25 payout



Blackjack with an ace and a jack
CHF 100 payout



Blackjack with an ace and a jack of the same color
CHF 250 payout



Blackjack with an ace and a jack of the same suit
CHF 350 payout

Minor Jackpot

he minor jackpot is paid out when the player has an ace and a jack of the same suit and the bank any ace and jack **Payout according to the “minor” jackpot display**

Major Jackpot

The major jackpot is paid out when both the player and the bank have an ace and a jack of the same suit. The player and the bank can have different suits **Payout according to the “major” jackpot display**

Additional Information
