

Omaha Hold'em Poker



«Grab the "pot" for yourself!»

Quick reference guide for excitement at the poker table

Playing Omaha Hold'em is fun! Take a seat and delve into the captivating world of our casino. Questions? Talk to us! We are pleased to make your visit to our casino as pleasant as possible. And who knows, maybe you'll hit your lucky streak today!

Table

- Omaha Hold'em is played at a table with 2 to 10 players.
- Players bet by placing their chips over the betting line.
- Players at the table play against each other. The casino dealer is in charge of the game.



Rules of the game

- The object of the game is to win the pot (bets that have been made) by beating your opponents with the best poker hand or by being the only player not to fold.
- One of the players is designated as the dealer and given a "dealer button".
 After each game, the next player in a clockwise direction becomes the dealer and the cards are dealt beginning with the "small blind".
- Five community cards ("board cards") are revealed during the maximum four betting rounds, which are combined with the four in-hand cards ("hole cards") to make a poker hand. The player must use two hole cards and three board cards to make the hand.

How to play

- The "table stake" is the bet placed by each player. You have the option to raise it between games.
- Small blind: before the cards are dealt, the player seated to the left of the dealer posts the small blind.
- Big blind: at the same time, the second player to the left of the dealer posts the big blind, which is the minimum bet.
- Hole cards: each player is dealt four cards, face down.
- The betting round begins after all players have been dealt four cards.
- "Pre-flop", first betting round: the player to the left of the big blind starts.
- They can fold, call (match all previous bets without raising) or raise the stake.
- Moving clockwise, each player makes the same decision. If no one raises the minimum bet, the big blind player can reopen the betting with an increase.

- "Flop", second betting round: the dealer reveals the first three board cards (flop) in the middle of the table. The next active player to the left of the dealer goes first – in this and each subsequent round. From this round, players can "check" (pass on the decision without betting).
- The other players then declare whether they check, call or raise the stake.
- Players who want to fold place their cards, face down, over the betting line.
- "Turn", third betting round: the dealer reveals a fourth board card (turn) before the third betting round begins.
- "River", fourth betting round: the dealer turns over the fifth and final board card (river) before the fourth and final betting round.
- "Showdown": after the final betting round, the players still in the game face off in the showdown. At this point, the player with the best fivecard hand is revealed, combining the four hole cards and the five board cards. In Omaha Hold'em, the hand is made up of two hole cards and three board cards.
- The player with the best poker hand (see table for winning combinations) is the winner and takes the pot. If several players have the same card score, the pot is split equally among the players ("split pot").
- As the casino does not serve as the banker in this game, a commission fee is charged.

Bets are placed at the table using chips; our staff will be happy to exchange your cash for chips. Foreign currencies can also be exchanged for chips at the cage at any time.
