What is Roulette?

Roulette is one of the world's most popular table games, instantly recognisable by its distinctive wheel. But how does it actually work? Let's take a closer look and discover why Roulette is such a thrilling and entertaining game.

The Aim of Roulette

The goal of the game is simple: you **try to predict the number on which the ball will land** – the slot where it comes to rest in the wheel.

If your prediction is correct, you can win up to 35 times your stake with just a single chip.

The Wheel



Game Sequence

The game is played in three phases.

1. Placing Your Bets

A roulette table features 37 numbers: **0 (Zero) to 36**.
You place your chips on the table – either on individual numbers, on groups of numbers, or on what are known as outside bets:

Even Chances: Red/Black, Even/Odd, Low (1–18) / High (19–36)

Dozens: 1–12, 13–24, 25–36

Columns: One of the three vertical rows.

If chips belonging to other guests are already placed on a betting area, place your chips next to them (for Even Chances, Dozens and Columns). On number fields, place your chips directly on top of the existing chips.

2. The Spin

The dealer sets the wheel in motion and launches the ball.

You may place or adjust your bets until the dealer makes a hand gesture over the table to signal the end of betting.

Then comes the familiar call: **“No more bets!”**

3. Who Wins?

Once the ball has dropped, the dealer announces the winning number.

It is then marked with the dolly. **If you have placed a bet on that number, you win!** All associated winning bets are paid out as well.
After that, a new round begins.

How to Place Your Bets?

Roulette is played with **value chips or colour chips**. You can place cash on the table to receive chips. Colour chips are only valid at the specific table where you received them – making it easy to recognise your own bets. When you finish playing, the dealer will exchange your colour chips for value chips. These can then be cashed out at the cashier's desk.* Information on minimum and maximum bets is displayed at every table.

*There is one exception at Swiss Casino Winterthur:
value chips are deposited directly onto your personal or anonymised cashless card directly at the table.
You can then cash out your card at the payout machine.

The Racetrack

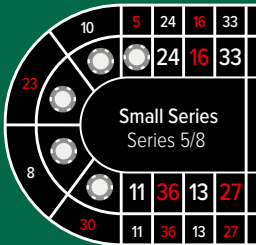


If you play Roulette more frequently, you may prefer certain sequences of numbers. The racetrack is an oval layout showing the numbers in the same order as they appear on the wheel. This allows you to place bets on neighbouring numbers or specific series. The dealer will place these bets for you.

Neighbours

In **neighbour bets**, you place a bet on one number as well as up to four neighbouring numbers to the left and right of it on the wheel.

Example: 23 with two neighbours means you are betting on 5, 8, 10, 23 and 30 – a total of five chips. If any of these numbers hits, you win 35 times your stake.



Series Bets

On the racetrack, you can place **four well-known series bets:**

Zero Game, Small Series (5/8),

Large Series (0/2/3), and

Orphelins. These cover specific sections of the wheel.

The payout ratio varies depending on which number is hit.



Playing with the Swiss Casinos Member Club Card

With your Swiss Casinos Member Club Card, you automatically collect reward points and level points. Reward points can be redeemed in the rewards shop, while level points increase your status within the Member Club. For each game you play, you always receive the same number of reward points and level points.



Glossary

- **Dolly:** The transparent marker used to indicate the winning number.
- **Finals:** A bet on numbers that share the same last digit, e.g. 3, 13, 23, 33.
- **Ball:** Determines the game result when it comes to rest in the roulette wheel.
- **Manque:** Numbers 1 to 18.
- **Passe:** Numbers 19 to 36.
- **Zero:** The number 0 in Roulette.
